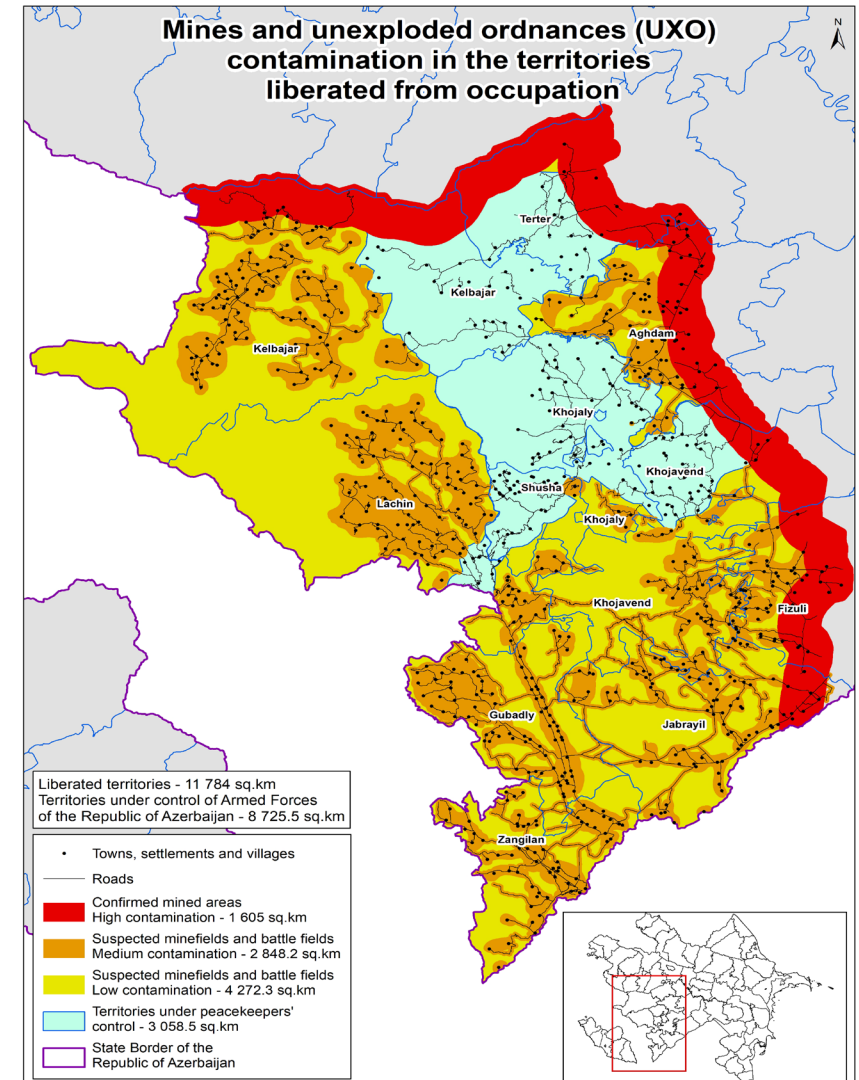




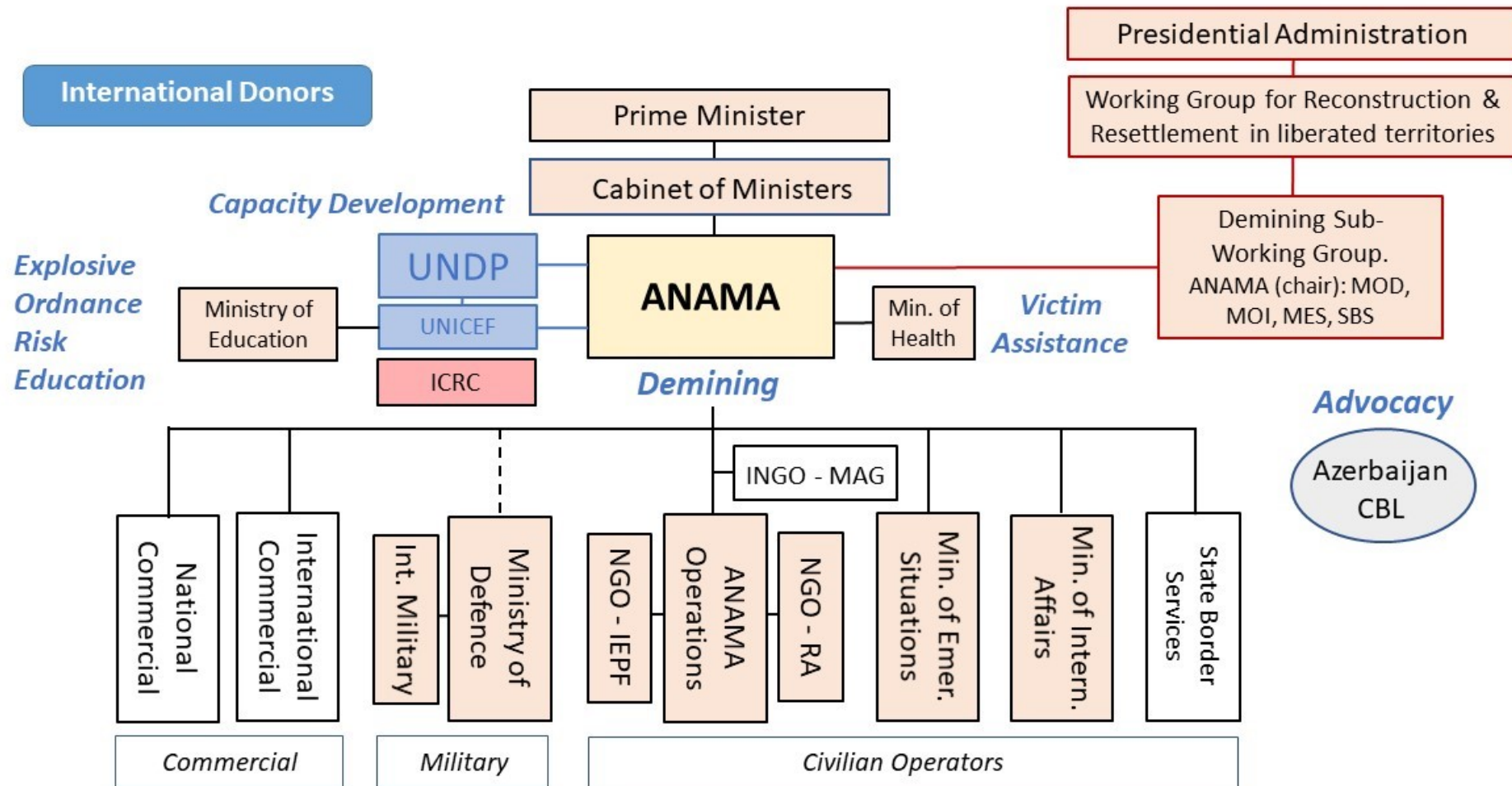
AZERBAIJAN HUMANITARIAN MINE ACTION NEEDS ASSESSMENT

1. 30 years of conflict resulting in high density of contamination in a relatively small area. Area was completely abandoned following the ceasefire resulting in very limited information on contamination.
2. +259 victims since 10/11/2020
3. 800,000 IDP's awaiting return
4. Complete need to redevelop the region's critical infrastructure
5. Peace agreement yet to be agreed and ratified along with continued ceasefire violations.
6. Azerbaijan has not signed to any conventions

NTS Survey		Systematic approach to better define contamination across the 7 regained districts.
Information Management		Improve IM systems & reporting processes that function & are fit for purpose to support a growing complex program
Operational capacities		Strengthen & upgrade the pool of equipment including introduction of new technologies & innovation
Coordination Mechanisms		Improve coordination bodies & mechanisms in Baku & at district levels appropriate for the expanding program
Capacity development needs assessment (on-going)		Obtain greater granularity of needs to establish a refined capacity development work plan

Pressing Priorities



1. Enhance Planning through enhanced survey approaches
2. Increased capacity through NNGO's.
3. Continued support to institutional capacity building of ANAMA.
4. Increased mechanical demining assets.
5. Further development of ADS (training/advice)
6. Continued development of female capacity in demining.
7. Demarcation and permanent fencing
8. Mainstreaming EORE throughout the Operational Concept.
9. VA strengthening at the institutional level
