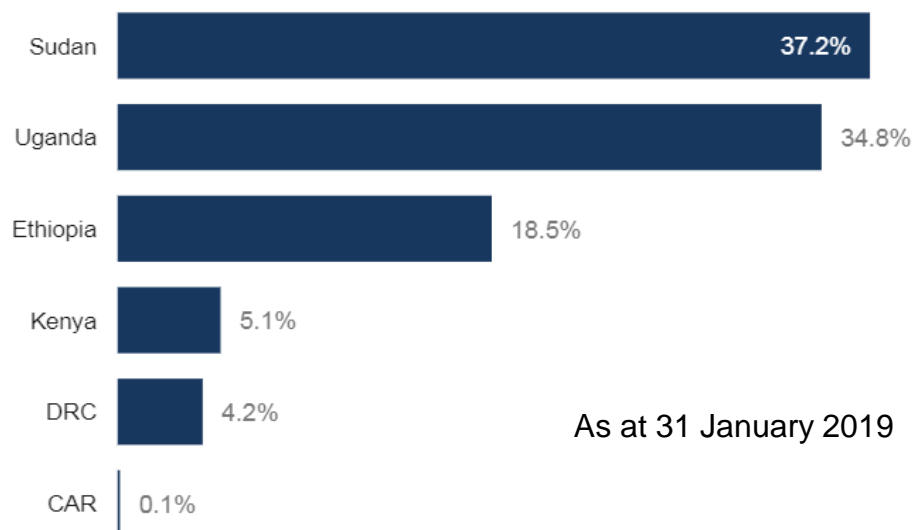

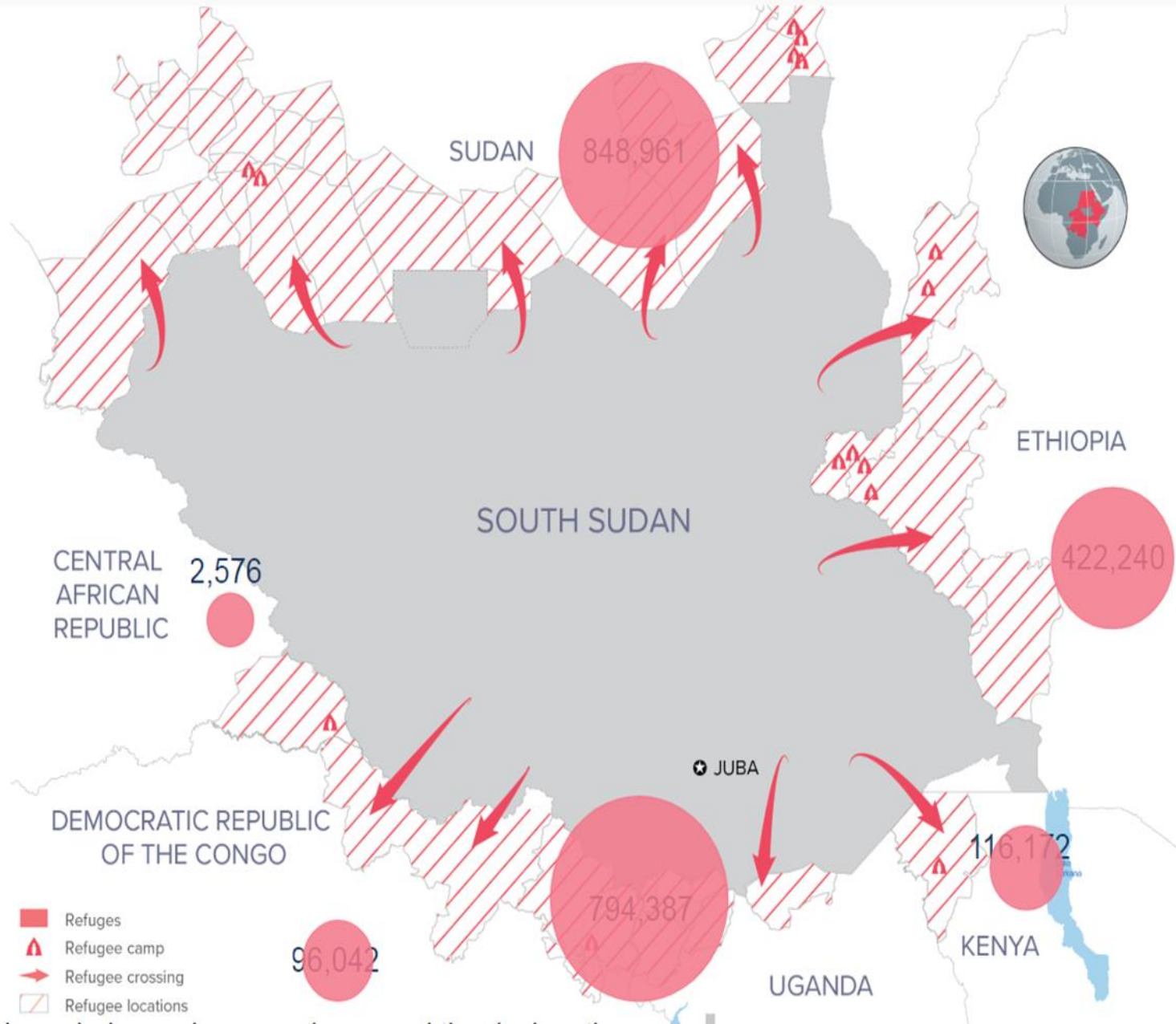

As at 31 January 2019

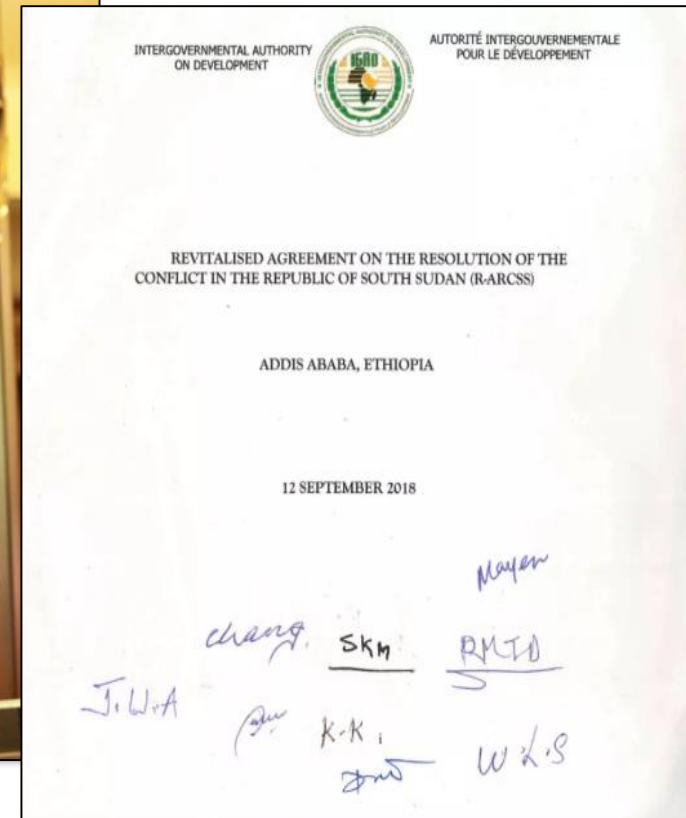


Regional Context (Cont'd): South Sudan Situation as a Women and Children's Crisis

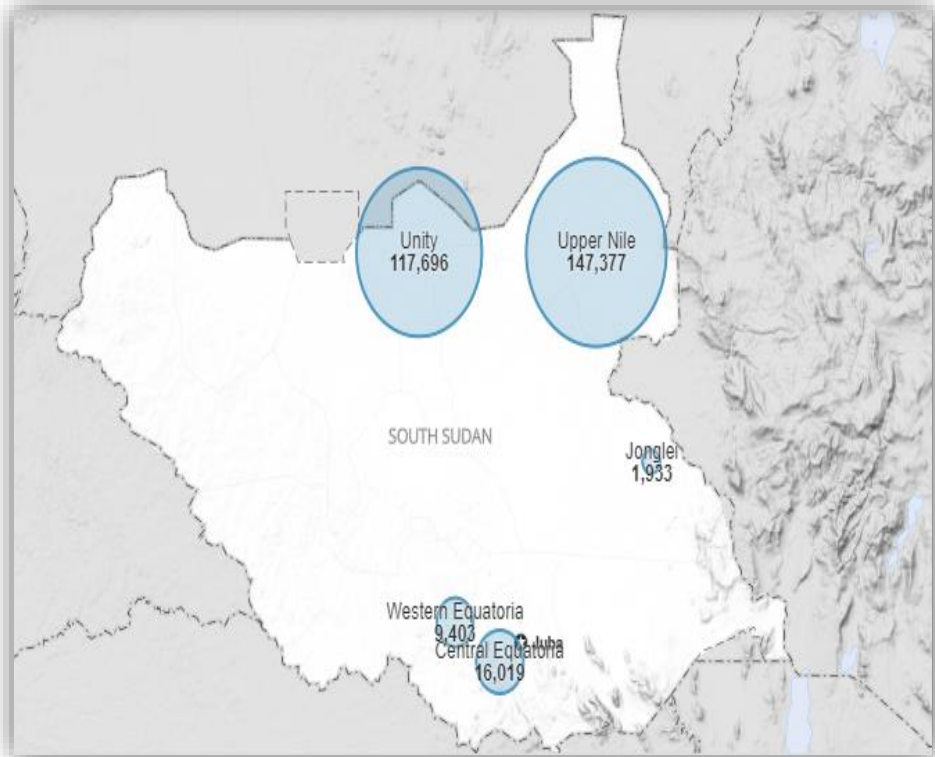


- 80% of refugee population comprised of women and children (over 60% are under the age of 18)
- 50,000 children are without their parents (unaccompanied or separated)
- Within South Sudan, approximately 85% of IDPs are women and children

Durable Solutions Current Prospects

- UNHCR seeking interim (not comprehensive) solutions at this time.
- UNHCR is not organizing, promoting or facilitating voluntary repatriation to South Sudan as the conditions for return in safety and dignity are not yet in place.
- Pendular spontaneous return movements taking place.
- More international solidarity is needed.

Durable Solutions Current Prospects (Cont'd)

- Preservation of the asylum space;
- Investment into community based and infrastructural reintegration and rehabilitation;
- Promotion of accountability, security, justice, and the rule of law in South Sudan;
- Peace and reconciliation efforts;
- Support of forcibly displaced persons to be effectively represented to shape the transitional and post-conflict institutions of South Sudan; and
- Inclusion of displaced persons in national development planning.

Durable Solutions Priorities for South Sudanese

- Solutions in line with the Global Compact on Refugees:
 - Advancing socio-economic empowerment of refugees and host communities in refugee hosting countries through support to the 2019-2020 Regional Refugee Response Plan.
 - Creating favorable conditions for the return of forcibly displaced persons.
 - Resettlement and complimentary pathways.
